#### THE PRESENT WE INHABIT

In the last 200 years the landscape (tangible, real) we inhabit within these lines of the map has changed dramatically. What has not changed is the certainty that -we are, we become- from this surroundings.

The *identity - place I inhabit* relationship is inexhaustible, and this infinite multiplicity of interpretations is re-signified from the possibility, in the midst (still) of this pandemic, of losing everything that makes us who we are (we were?); families, relationships, routines, jobs, spaces.

How things have changed. How much nostalgia, how many questions. The curatorship that I propose for this collaboration, aims to respond from the work of six Peruvian artists; How is the landscape that would survive our disappearance?

How is it that Ivet Salazar, Cindy Ramirez, Liliana Ávalos, Valentina Maggiolo, Heydi Mori and Sandra Cáceres imagine these scenarios, or the stories that would tell (in an apocalyptic way) the spaces we leave behind?

What messages could we find in the very nature of the material with which they work, in all this virtual archive that survives us as archaeological remains... or in the domestic elements now abandoned that made our days? What traces do we find in the present, which already tell our story?

On the other hand, we cannot deny the conceptual influence that virtuality has and the way we approach these artworks. This new way of "telling" must also be embraced. This medium that also signifies... because it has already become the new landscape we inhabit. 04

# AHOGADA / DROWNED

# DES/PRO/TEJIDA UN/PROTECTED

Tejida (Woven). Exposing our most fragile areas, leave us vulnerable to breakdown, ridicule and death.

Pro/tejida (Protected). When we recognize them, the instinct to protect, hide and wrap them in shells in inevitable.

*Des/pro/tejida* (Un/protected). These shells, instead of protecting us, can create a barrier between our fragility and our conscience, barriers which don't allow us to see or feel them and thus consequently and ironically, we stop protecting them, because how can we take care of them if they don't exist?

This piece is exposed to direct fire that leaves stains with each flame and that, finally, ends up breaking its shell. An obvious break that exposes its inner tissue again. It contemplates the breaking of the shell and, by taking the experience to the edge of the abyss, it questions if a break is enough or if we should go further, and if our frailties must necessarily be protected.


